

## **BEACH RULES**

### **Pets**

Dogs are not allowed to run at large in subdivisions. Pets are allowed on Currituck County beaches, but must be under the owner's control, either by leash or voice command.

### **Beach Bonfires**

Beach fires are illegal on the Currituck Outer Banks. Glass is NOT permitted on the beach.

### **Lifeguards**

Lifeguards are on duty from 9:30am until 5:30pm daily. Roving Patrols (4wd trucks and ATV's) travel from the county line, north to Penny's Hill for your assistance.

Fixed lifeguard stands are located at:

Villages at Ocean Hill, Corolla Village Road, Shad Street, Bonito Street, and Sailfish Street (Whalehead Beach), Section P, Section F, and Section D (Ocean Sands), and the Currituck County Public Beach Access (Pine Island)

It is strongly urge you not to enter the water after the lifeguards go off duty.  
NEVER swim after dark.

## **CURRITUCK COUNTY BEACH DRIVING REGULATIONS**

1. No vehicle of any type shall be parked on the beach strand in an area extending from the north beach access ramp northward for one-half mile. Violators will be towed.
2. 35 mph is the speed limit unless located within 300 ft of pedestrians then it is 15 mph.
3. All vehicles parked on the beach must be parked in the area east of the dune line and west of the hard packed sand adjacent to the water edge.
4. There shall be no obstructions including chairs, coolers, fishing lines, holes, trenches or any other items allowed to block the foreshore that would restrict vehicular movement in a north-south direction along the dune line or the foreshore which is the hard packed sand from the last high tide mark to the low water mark. VIOLATORS WILL BE TOWED.
5. Operators of any motor vehicle must be 16 years of age and possess a valid driver's license.
6. It shall be unlawful to operate any vehicle on ANY sand dune.
7. Commercial fishermen are exempt from beach driving regulations while actually engaged in fishing or setting of seines in the Atlantic Ocean.
8. Overnight camping of any type is prohibited. Bonfires are prohibited.
